# Local Networking Events

## Greece

Last December, IDEC S.A. organised an online **local networking workshop** in Piraeus, Greece, to promote the STREAM project. The event brought together 111 participants from companies, VET organisations, public authorities, and other relevant stakeholder groups.

The workshop introduced the **STREAM Micro-credentials System and the MOOC**, focusing on how green, digital, and inclusive skills can be assessed and validated for VET tutors and company mentors. Discussions also explored the role of these competences in strengthening Work-Based Learning and supporting the green and digital transition.

**Feedback** from the event was very positive, with respondents expressing strong satisfaction with the organisation, speakers, content quality, and relevance of the topics. Participants also reported that the workshop helped them better understand digital skills for VET trainers in the green economy and increased their knowledge in this area.

Overall, the workshop successfully reached its target audience, generated strong interest, and confirmed the relevance of the STREAM project's micro-credentials approach for supporting VET professionals in developing green and digital competences.

## Ireland

On 27 May, Dublin Chamber and City of Dublin ETB hosted an in-person **STREAM local networking workshop** at Dublin Chamber's offices on Clare Street, Dublin. The event brought together 42 participants from Dublin Chamber member companies and City of Dublin ETB staff.

The workshop introduced the Erasmus+ STREAM project, its Micro-credentials System, and the STREAM Moodle platform. Participants explored how digital, green, and inclusive competences can support Work-Based Learning, international mobility, and the professional development of VET tutors, company mentors, and WBL coordinators.

The session also highlighted the importance of staff upskilling, micro-credentials, and future workforce resilience. Attendees were introduced to key project outputs, the STREAM MOOC, and relevant European competence frameworks, including GreenComp, LifeComp, DigComp, and DigCompEdu.



**STREAM Ambassadors** Leanne Clerkin and Sinead Lambe shared their experiences of completing the learning platform and discussed the value of the micro-credential in their professional and personal development. The event concluded with an open discussion and a call for participants to engage with the course.

Overall, the workshop was well received. Participants were highly engaged and found the MOOC relevant to their work, particularly its recognition of practitioners involved in organising Work-Based Learning.
